Bobble Lace Scarf

Materials List:

Tapestry Needle

Yarn

2 skeins Plymonth Yarn® Company Encore® (75% acrylic, 25% wool, 100g, 200yd) 4/Medium, color #0515 Wedgewood

Hooks & Notions Gauge US I-9 (5.5 mm) 4 dc = 1" (2.5 cm) Measurements 6.5" x 60"

(150cm x 16.25cm) (excluding fringe)

Bobble: (Yo, insert hook into st, yo, pull through, yo, pull through 2 loops on hook) 8 times, yo, pull through 9 loops on hook. Slip stitch.

NOTE: Patterns requires 9 + 8, to increase or decrease add or subtract 9 ch in foundation ch.

Row 1 (RS): Working in blo, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each ch across. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (1st dc), dc in next dc, *ch 2, sk 2 dc, dc in next dc; repeat * across, ending with dc in top of ch-3. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in ch-2 sp; repeat * across, ending with dc in 2nd to last dc, dc in top of ch-3. Turn.

Row 4 (WS): Ch 3, dc in next dc, *ch 2, sk 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, Bobble in next dc, dc in next 3 dc; repeat * across, ending with ch 2, sk 2 dc, dc in next dc, dc in top of ch 3. Turn.

Note: Since you are working on the WS, push the Bobble center out to the back so it will pop on the RS.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in next dc, *2 dc in ch-2 sp, dc in next 7 dc (one dc is worked into top of Bobble); repeat * across, ending with 2 dc in ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, dc in top of ch 3. Turn.

Repeat Rows 2-5 until measures 5" (12.5cm) or desired width.

Finishing Rows

Row 1: Repeat Row 2.

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each ch and dc across row. Fasten off. Weave in ends if not adding fringe.

Fringe (Optional)

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Add strands of yarn by loosely wrapping yarn around a DVD case or cardboard that is 8" (20cm) wide. Cut along the bottom. Pick up 12 strands, loop them in half through first row on each end, pull loop with hook from front to back, loop over strands and tighten into knot. After complete, slightly tug on each strand to tighten the knot. When finished, trim bottom of fringe to even it along edge.

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
